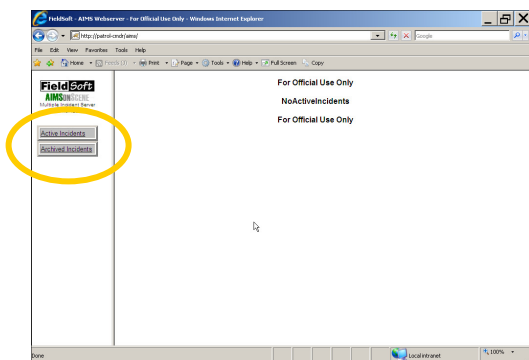


Did You Know That

Almost anyone with a Microsoft Internet Explorer browser can view both current and archived incident data being managed by AIMSonSceneMU (multi-user) software. All a browser user needs to do to see the data is enter the correct URL address followed by /aims/.

Let's assume for example, that AIMSonSceneMU server software is running on a server computer which has a computer name of "Patrol-Cmdr". Under such circumstances a user would type `http://patrol-cmdr/aims/` into the address bar of their browser and press enter. The following screen would appear shortly, assuming that access to the web server is not otherwise restricted. The user could then select to view data by clicking on either the "Active Incidents" button or the "Archived Incidents" button (both buttons are circled below).



The Browser view in fact is used to retrieve archived incident data, which includes. Report Logs, Messages between workgroup members, and ICS 214s for each resource managed through the software.

Of course you may now be wondering how an agency can keep prying eyes from viewing active or archived data. Access to the data can be restricted to authorized parties via the Apache Tomcat web server software application that is shipped with AIMSonSceneMU. In brief, the system administrator can set up the server so that only those with authorized user names and passwords can access server data. Moreover, secure socket layer (SSL) communications between AIMSonScene clients and AIMSonScene server software is possible. Here again security is controlled via the Apache Tomcat web server application. SSL can in fact be "turned on" if and when SSL data exchange is desired or required..

Additional user access and SSL information can be found in the Apache Tomcat documentation found on the server software installation CD-ROM.

Please White List Emails With A "@fieldsoft.com" Address If Your SSSE Subscription Is Current

One customer with a current software support and software enhancement (SSSE) subscription has reported that he and the other designated contact within their fire department have not received any software update alerts via email. As far as we can determine the last alert was successfully delivered about six months ago.

FieldSoft is currently working with the customer to resolve the problem. One request we put to the customer is that he white list us in the email program on his desktop computer. We also asked that his IT support group white list us in the hardware based firewall/spam blocker that his organization uses.

FieldSoft is now putting the same request out to other customers with current SSSE subscriptions in place. Specifically, please white list emails with "@fieldsoft.com" if you want to receive release update notifications.

Finally, please send an email to information@fieldsoft.com or contact Mark Bouchard if you have a current SSSE subscription and your agency does not receive an email announcement by November 5, 2007 regarding the October software release.

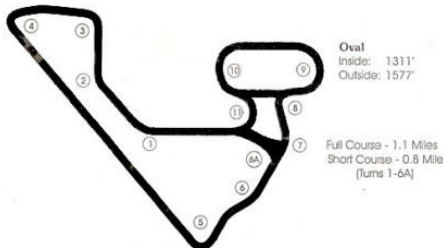
Mark Bouchard's Latest High Performance Driving Exploits

Upcoming AIMSonScene Software Enhancements

Do you have a current software support and software enhancement (SSSE) subscription? If so, all you need to do to get the latest available update is 1.) point your web browser to the download URL printed on the AIMSonScene software CD-ROM case shipped to you, 2.) enter the user name and password also found on the case, and 3.) respond to prompts that appear.

The latest versions of AIMSonScene software, the FieldSoft API SDK, the FieldSoft Interface Application (FSIA) To CAD, and the FieldSoft interface To Grace TPASS are currently available via Internet download.

The next set of enhancements is scheduled for release on or about October 31, 2007. Most of the many enhancements and fixes in the next release are not visible to end users. One unseen example is software code refactoring that took place in the peer-to-peer module. The end result is that resource transfer now takes place more efficiently.

One of the visible improvements on the other hand involves the AIMSonScene User Application feature. Specifically, new code ensures that web browser pages snap into the GUI as the program design calls for.

The release after next is scheduled for January 31, 2008.
