Everyone using AIMSonScene multiuser (MU) software as part of an incident workgroup is <u>automatically notified</u> whenever a new member joins the incident. Likewise, every workgroup member is <u>automatically notified</u> when a strategy mode change is completed. Basically, a message alert window pops up each time there is a strategy mode change or a new member joins the incident workgroup.

Next AIMSonScene Software Release

The last AIMSonScene software release took place on or about March 31, 2009. The next two are scheduled for June 30, 2009 and September 30, 2009 respectively; barring the unforeseen.

The June release includes a number of enhancements. End users for example will be able to force a "Call for PAR" at any time. The Peer-to-peer setup bug in Configuration Module | Miscellaneous Tab | P2P Network settings screen is fixed.

The software interface to the NFPA Standard 1982 (2007 edition) TPASS® 4 two-way transceiver is being enhanced. Specifically, Grace is coding an interface between their In-Command software GUI, and AIMSonScene ICS and personnel accountability software.

For example, the interface will enable incident commanders to automatically receive "Mayday" signals, simply initiate reliable hazard zone evacuations, conduct automated "PAR" checks, and respond to semi-automated "Roll Calls". Better Personnel Accountability In Nash County, NC

The Nash County, NC Fire/Rescue Assoc., the Nashville, NC Fire Department, and Eastern Data Plastic Card Systems Inc. have taken the County's Personnel Accountability system to new levels of simplicity. County first responders have moved beyond cumbersome and marginally effective nametags, passports and status boards. The new and better system is comprised of magnetic stripe encoded ID cards and card readers, *interfaced* to AIMSonScene ICS software.

According to Nashville Fire Chief Tim Pope, "Once personnel arrive ... I swipe their card and they are populated into Staging." He then moves them to other divisions or groups managed with AIMS-onScene by simply clicking the computer touch screen.
