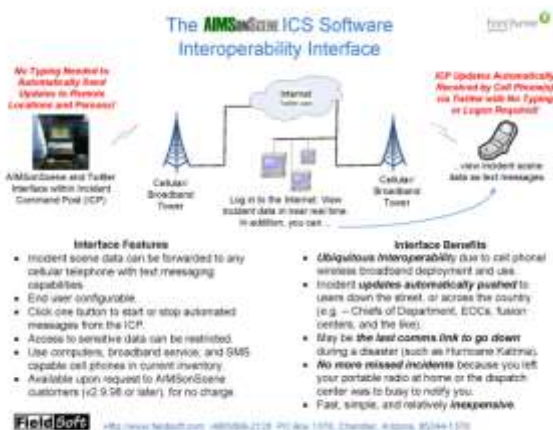


### Did You Know That?

The AIMSonScene Interoperability Interface (illustrated below and in full size on the last page) is available on request and for no charge to any AIMSonScene customer with version 2.9.98 or later software. Anyone running AIMSonScene and the Interface can automatically broadcast incident updates to Internet connected computers or cellular telephones located down the street or across the country.

### Latest Software Release Delayed

The September 30, 2009 release of AIMSonScene has been delayed. The reason has to do with an *involuntary* “migration” of FieldSoft’s web site ([fieldsoft.com](http://fieldsoft.com)), unlock code generation application ([fieldsoft.com/pw](http://fieldsoft.com/pw)), and software download web application ([fieldsoft.com/ssse](http://fieldsoft.com/ssse)) to a “new system”. Unfortunately, the *involuntary* migration by FieldSoft’s Internet Service Provider (ISP) trashed everything except our general web site ([fieldsoft.com](http://fieldsoft.com)). The “migration” started

in late September and the fallout continues through today.

Corrective action has been for FieldSoft to walk through our web software code line by line, find issues related to the migration, and then code a fix. We are in the process of doing so. We hope to have all web application issues resolved, and to ship the latest AIMSonScene software release no later than November 13, 2009.

Please contact your AIMSonScene VAR or AIMSonScene reseller by telephone or email if you need an unlock code during the troubles with our web applications. Please be ready to provide the “application serial number” needed to generate an unlock code.

FieldSoft regrets any difficulties that you may have experienced pursuant to the web site “migration”.

### FRI 2009, Dallas, TX

Mark Bouchard of FieldSoft and Ben Meche of KBKI staffed the FieldSoft exhibit booth during Fire Rescue International 2009 in early September. We were able to introduce the AIMSonScene Interoperability Interface during FRI. In addition, passersby were able to view FieldSoft’s nine foot dino-



saur. Few command officers passing by the booth attempted to disprove the “Simple enough for any Dinosaur” sign held up by the nine (9) foot critter. Oh well, maybe next year.

The AIMSonScene interface was not the only new technology demonstrated during FRI. Craig Walker of Grace Industries showed a new interface between Grace’s In-Command personnel accountability system software and AIMSonScene. Both software applications run on the same ruggedized laptop.



The In-Command to AIMSonScene interface makes it possible for one person to manage both the incident command process and personnel accountability from a single computer.

Benefits of integrated command and accountability include reduced command post work load; more effective management of incident strategy, tactics and hazards; and substantially better focus on responder safety and survival.

Grace has been working on the interface for more than a year. It and the Watchdog transceiver (shown above) replace the older Command Receiver (AKA - big yellow box)

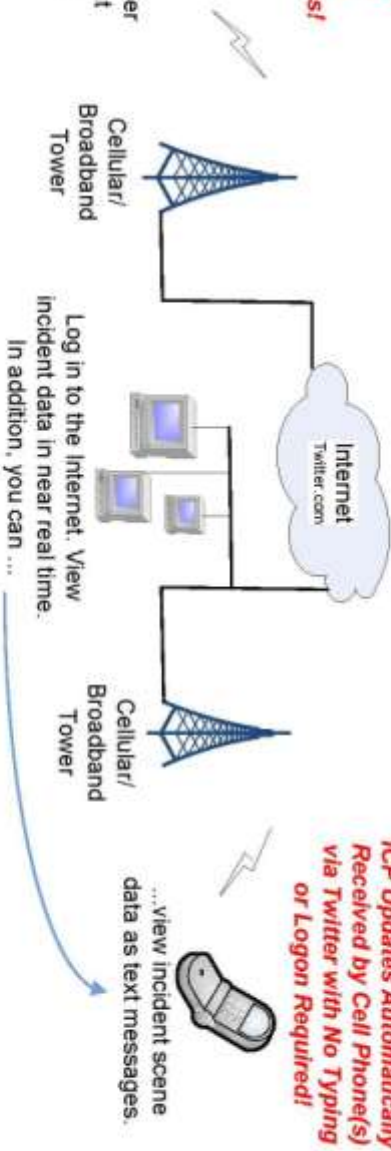

- Incident **updates automatically pushed** to users down the street, or across the country (e.g. – Chiefs of Department, EOCs, fusion centers, and the like).

- **No more missed incidents** because you left your portable radio at home or the dispatch center was to busy to notify you.
